Pursuant to Section 134.128-134 of the Texas Surface Coal Mining and Reclamation Act, TEX. NAT. RES. CODE ANN. CH 134 (Vernon Supp. 2007) and Sections 12.312-.313 of the Coal Mining Regulations, Tex. R.R. Comm'n 16 TEX. ADMIN. CODE Ch. 12 (West 2008). Texas Westmoreland Coal Company, 12420 Highway 39, Jewett, Texas 75846 has submitted its application to the Railroad Commission of Texas for Phase I, Phase II, Phase II, III, and Phase I, II, III release of reclamation performance bond obligations on a total of 4,984.4 acres for a portion of its Jewett Mine, Permit No. 32F as shown in the title of this notice. The Jewett Mine permit area is located in Limestone, Leon, and Freestone Counties Texas, north of Jewett, Texas and south of Farrar, Texas on FM 39. Permit No. 32F was approved December 21, 2004.

The applicant requests a Phase I partial release of reclamation obligations for backfilling, regrading and drainage control, Phase II release of reclamation obligations for revegetation k, and a Phase III total release of reclamation obligations for conclusion of all mining activities. The application is made up of two volumes, with the second volume containing a groundwater and surface water assessment. The areas requested are located in Areas A, B, C and D of the mine area as shown in black in the adjacent figure. Mining operations were conducted on acres between 1986 and 2001. Final grading was accomplished on this area between 1987 and 2002. Switchgrass, Indiangrass, Kleingrass, Wilman lovegrass, Sideoats grama, Old world bluestem. Bahiagrass, and Coastal bermudagrass were planted between 1988 and 2003. Various tree species were planted as enhancement features. Structures within the bonds release area include 20 permanent ponds, two permanent roads, 13 drop structures, one permanent diversion and one permanent erosion control structure. The approved post-mine land use in Pastureland, Industrial commercial and Developed Water Resources. The accepted bonds for Permit No. 32F total \$57,500,000. The applicant does not seek adjustment to the approved bond as a result of this application; however, an eligible bond reduction amount may be determined.

Interested persons are invited to submit written comments on the application withing 30 days after the last date of publication of this notice in a local newspaper. All written comments, objections or requests for public hearing or informal conference on the application should be directed to:

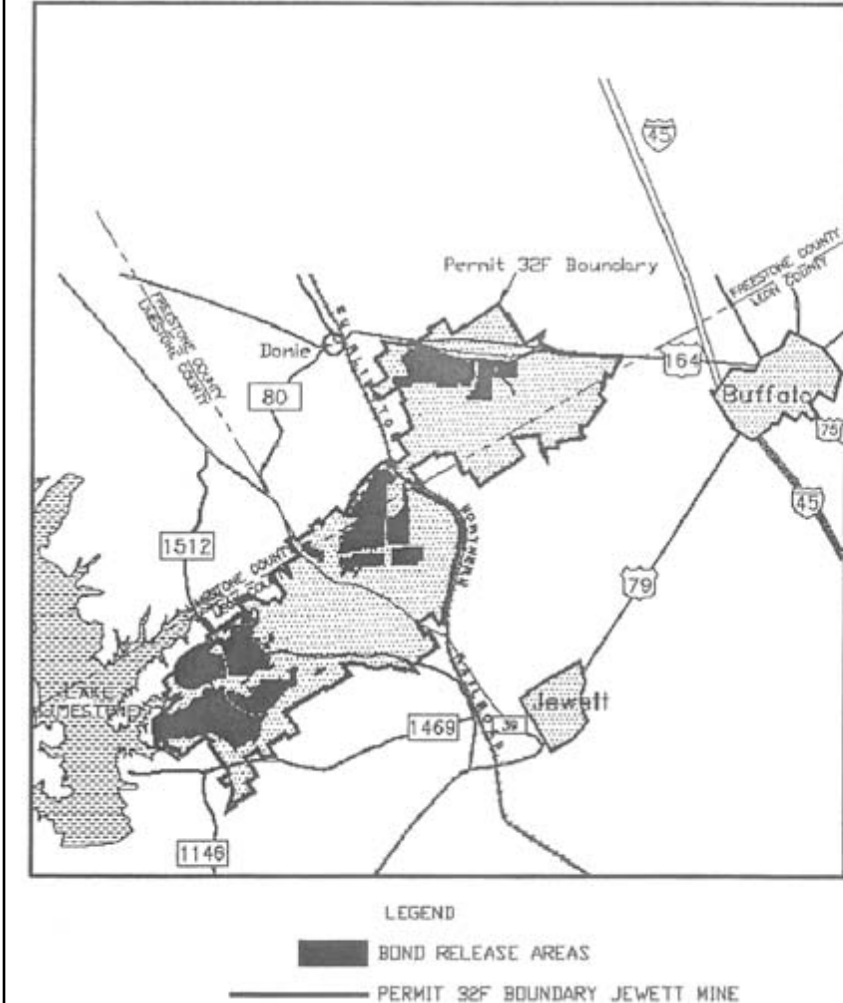
