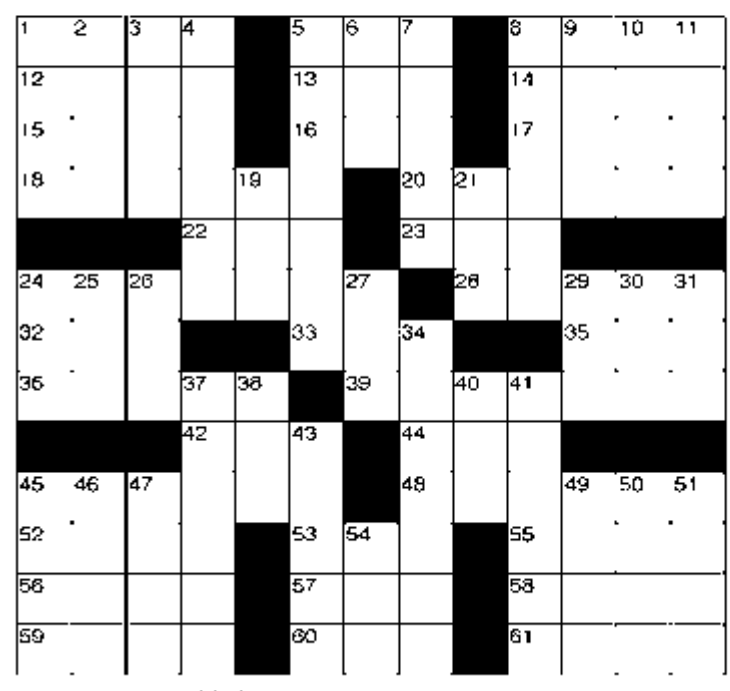

secured a job before even graduating. "We had a wonderful career development department at my school and I had a really great counselor," she says.

Miss Mote, a native of Lufkin, looks forward to her role as an FCS agent who has firsthand knowledge of the support the agency provides to a community. As a child she spent a lot of time at her grandfather's ranch between Crockett and Grapeland.

"We would have a tree growing on the ranch and we would go the extension office to find out what type of tree it was. We were constantly taking soil samples to the agents," says Miss Mote.

After only a few weeks on the job, she has already completed her first nutritional program, Cooking Well With Diabetes, and she looks forward to implementing new programs in the coming year.

Her academic background and employment experience make her a natural fit for nutritional education. Miss Mote worked as a catering supervisor for Aramark where she created menus for guest populations up to five hundred and has extensive education in nutrition through life cycles, food service systems, ecology of foods and nutrition and food protective management. But she plans to extend

her focus beyond the realm of nutrition, once she gets a chance to breath which should be sometime this week. Miss Mote says the week-
